Utility Rate Increases

Water Rate Increases as approved by The Public Utilities Board Order No. 138/22, effective for consumption as of January 1, 2025 are as follows:

All metered water sold in the Rural Municipality of Dufferin will be charged at the rate of \$21.58 per 1,000 gallons, with minimums as follows:

All **Bulk** water sold by the Rural Municipality of Dufferin will be charged at the rate of \$23.20 per 1,000 gallons.


Municipal Elections - October 28th, 2026

An Opportunity to Serve Your Community Your community is important. If you'd like to have a say in its future, why not take this opportunity to run for Municipal Council? Serving on Council is a serious responsibility, but it is also one of the most fulfilling roles you can undertake. As a member of Council, you will be giving back to your community, and the decisions you make will help chart the future course for your municipality.

On October 28th, 2026 voters in our municipality will elect individuals to sit on Council. If you-or someone you know-is interested in taking on this role, now is the time to find out what's involved in becoming a candidate. To run for election, you must be; 18 years of age, a Canadian citizen, a Manitoba resident, and a resident or property owner in the RM of Dufferin for at least six months prior to the election date. Prospective municipal election candidates must register with the Senior Election Official (SEO) during the registration period before they may begin to accept contributions, incur expenses, fundraise or borrow money for their campaign.

For the office of Reeve: Between May 1 and September 22, 2026

For the office of Councillor: Between June 30 and September 22, 2026

Use the account number (numbers only) listed on your bill. If you require assistance through this process, let us know.

On our website you can pay through PaySimply using your credit card. There is a service fee applied at the time of transaction for the use of this service that the RM of Dufferin does not earn any revenue from.

Pre-Authorized Payments: Automatic withdrawal for full payment of your bill or a set monthly budget amount can be arranged. Contact us for more information or to get set up for pre-authorized payments.
